2001 CALENDAR

2/9/2001 – FIRST HALF TAXES DUE (Last day to pay 1st half taxes without penalty.)

2/10/2001 - 10% of the unpaid 1st half taxes will be added as penalty. If paid within 10 days after due date, 5% of penalty will be waived

7/13/2001 - SECOND HALF TAXES DUE (Last day to pay 2nd half taxes without penalty.)

7/14/2001 - 10% of the unpaid 2nd half taxes will be added as penalty. If paid within 10 days after due date, 5% of penalty will be waived

8/1/2001 - 6.0% of the unpaid prior years delinquency will be added as interest.

12/1/2001 – 3.0% of the total unpaid balances will be added as interest.

PAYMENT PLANS

Delinquent Payment Plan

TEPP (TAX ESCROW PAYMEN PLAN)

This is a new payment option implemented in 2000.

Pre-pay your taxes monthly

No fees or charges OR no discounts or interest earned

Coupons will be sent with suggested payment amounts and dates

You decide what you want to pay and when

First half taxes must be paid before you enroll in TEPP

You must be current to enroll in TEPP

OTHER PROGRAMS

SENIOR CITIZENS

Applications for the Homestead Exemption can be obtained from the **County Auditor's office**. You may qualify for the Homestead Exemption if:

1. You are 65 or older or are permanently and totally disabled and you own and live in the residence receiving the exemption.
2. You are a surviving spouse between 59 and 64 whose property was already receiving exemption.
3. Have an income less than \$23,700.
4. Applications due by the 1st Monday in June with the **Auditor's Office**.

APPRAISED PROPERTY VALUATION

According to the Ohio Revised Code Section 5715.19 any questions or complaints concerning the appraised value or your property must be filed by March 31, 2001 with the **County Auditor**.
